Helping Children Out of the Shadows and into the Light: Linking actions to raise awareness in churches and communities



The World Council of Churches has a long history of addressing issues of violence and abuse, motivated by facts like these:

- One in three women has experienced physical or sexual violence.
- More than eight out of ten girls have experienced street harassment before the age of 17.
- One in four children lives in a household with domestic violence.

Along with the Out of the Shadows campaign, we have developed several resources to help individuals, churches and communities to take action against violence and abuse and to make their concern about them more visible and effective.

Thursdays in Black



Thursdays in Black grew out of the WCC Decade of Churches in Solidarity with Women (1988-1998), in which stories of rape as a weapon of war, gender injustice, abuse, violence, and many related became much more visible. The campaign is simple but profound: Wear black on Thursdays. Wear a pin to declare you are part of the global movement resisting attitudes and practices that permit rape and violence. Show your respect for those who are resilient in the face of injustice and violence. Encourage others to join you.
